

**Dungeness Water Exchange
Land Division Mitigation Certificate Application Form**

INSTRUCTIONS:

Section 1 Contact information is required so the Exchange may contact you by phone & email for clarifications.

Section 2 asks for information about the plat for which mitigation certificates are being obtained. The well tag is provided by the Department of Ecology and is riveted to the well casing of the demonstration well, and any other pre-existing wells. The well tag shows a unique well identification number.

Section 3 identifies the individual lots to which the mitigation certificates will be assigned. The parcel numbers will be determined during the final plat review.

Section 4 asks for your signature agreeing to the chosen mitigation package.

Section 4. AGREEMENT

I understand that the mitigation purchased through this application, and the accompanying usage limitations will be transferred with ownership to all successive owners of the lots in this plat. They will be obligated to use no more (annual average) than the amount of water provided in the selected mitigation package above from the well listed above. If water needs increase beyond this, they must approach the Dungeness Water Exchange to inquire about purchasing a larger mitigation package. They must install a meter on any well or shared well connection, and comply with all Washington State Department of Ecology metering requirements. In the event that a reading cannot be detected from the meter during monitoring, the installation of a signal extender may be required to comply with metering requirements of your water mitigation certificate. The Dungeness Water Exchange mitigation certificate must be recorded, in reference to the above parcels, with the Clallam County Auditor. If the parent parcels for this subdivision are owned by a legal entity other than an individual, I certify that I am authorized to sign for the organization.
